Senior Re-entry Residency Position, Public Health & Preventive Medicine Program

2021-2022

The UBC Public Health & Preventive Medicine (PHPM) Residency Program is looking for candidates to fill two senior post-graduate year three (PGY-3) re-entry residency positions, the first available January 1, 2022, and the second July 1, 2022. There is some flexibility with start dates, however an estimated start date must be declared by interested candidates in their application materials.

Program Information

Based out of UBC's Point Grey campus in Vancouver, our PHPM program draws on training sites around the province including Richmond, Burnaby, Surrey, Victoria, Nanaimo, Kelowna, and Prince George. Re-entry residents will complete three years of training in PHPM including 12-months of graduate course work leading to a Master of Public Health, 12-months of general public health practice, and 12-months of specialty public health practice. Residents have the option of completing up to 28 months of their senior residency training outside of BC's Lower Mainland.

At the end of the post-graduate training program residents are eligible to sit examinations for fellowship with the Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons of Canada. Information about our residency program can be found at: https://www.spph.ubc.ca/programs/residency-program/

Eligibility

Candidates must be fully qualified generalist or specialist physicians *currently practicing in Canada under a full license* with a provincial Medical Regulatory Authority. A list of provincial medical regulatory authorities can be found at: https://fmrac.ca/members/.

Candidates must have completed at least *two years of an accredited post-graduate residency training program* recognized by the Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons of Canada or the College of Family Physicians of Canada. Candidates must be a *Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident, or Landed Immigrant*. A description of each status can be found at: https://www.canada.ca/en/services/immigration-citizenship.html.

Candidate Attributes

Successful candidates will have demonstrated:

- Commitment to and interest in public health and preventive medicine
- Conscientiousness, reliability, dependability, and organization skills
- Service orientation, social conscience, and compassion
- Understanding of and experience with equity, diversity, and inclusion
- Initiative and desire to learn
- · Stress tolerance, resilience, and adaptability
- Teamwork, social and interpersonal skills, communication skills
- Integrity and strong ethic

Application Process

UBC's PHPM re-entry residency positions are offered on a competitive basis by application outside of the Canadian Residency Matching Service (CaRMS) process. Our Selections Committee will accept application packages from interested candidates any time before February 28, 2022. Only shortlisted candidates will be contacted and offered an interviewed by the PHPM program

Selections Committee. Interviews will take place in November 2021 and March 2022. *An introductory meeting with the Program Director prior to applying is strongly recommended.*

A complete application package will consist of the following:

- Cover Letter or Personal Statement discussing professional aspirations, interests, and suitability for practice in PHPM (maximum two pages).
- Curriculum Vitae including post-graduate residency training, relevant continuing professional development, prior employment, prior medical staff appointments, community-based volunteer or international work, research activities and publications.
- *Prior Residency Training* including details such as dates and duration of rotations, and any requirements for remediation over the course of this training.
- Three Letters of Reference including one from a previous residency program director (or post-graduate dean who can speak on the program's behalf) AND a health authority senior medical director or hospital chief of staff. The letters should include information similar to that required by CaRMS which can be found at: https://www.carms.ca/match/r-1-main-residency-match/referee/reference-guidelines-r1-referee/.
- Official Transcripts for all post-secondary training including but not limited to undergraduate, post-graduate, and medical school programs (eg. BA, BSc, Masters, PhD, etc.).
- Proof of Licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada and active Licensure with a provincial Medical Regulatory Authority in Canada.

Deadline for applications is February 28, 2022.
