## **Qualifications:**

- Must have eligibility for an independent practice certificate from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario and specialty certification in **Public Health** and **Preventive Medicine** (formerly Community Medicine) from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in order to be considered for this opportunity.
- Must be competent to perform acts commonly delegated to staff in public health units (e.g., immunizations, STI testing)
- Exceptional communication skills (both verbal and written) are needed to function as a key liaison between Peel Public Health, stakeholders, the general public and health professionals.
- Strong problem-solving skills are required to resolve issues that arise from the complexity of the work of the department.
- Demonstrated ability to manage change through a structured process to advance the strategic priorities of the department is essential to your success.
- Demonstrated ability to build and maintain partnerships, negotiate and resolve conflict with external/internal stakeholders is a key function of this role.
- Strong organizational and administrative skills for the preparation of reports, briefings, updates and presentations to key stakeholders including Councilors, media and the public.
- Political astuteness, tact and diplomacy are a must.
- Demonstrate a commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion through continuous development, modeling inclusive behaviors, and proactively managing bias

In this role you will have the ability to work remotely and attend on-site when required based on operational requirements at the **7120 Hurontario St. Mississauga** worksite. The frequency of on-site activities may vary on a weekly basis and based on operational requirements. Your remote work location must be located within the province of Ontario.
